MOULTON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN NEIGHBOURHOOD AREA APPLICATION

This Application is made by Moulton Parish Council, a relevant body as defined by Schedule 9, Part 2 of the Localism Act 2012.

The primary contact points are:-

- 1. Cllr. N. Harris, Moulton Parish Council, c/o the Parish Clerk.
- 2. The Parish Clerk contact details as above.

The proposal to begin the process of formally creating a Neighbourhood Plan was resolved at a meeting of Moulton Parish Council on Monday 10 September 2012. A copy of the Minutes of the Meeting is attached to confirm.

The Parish Council has formed a Neighbourhood Plan Working Group (NPWG), currently consisting of Parish Councillors only. In the near future the NPWG will also include Villagers from across the Parish. Input into the Plan will also be sought from CWAC Planning, local commercial interests and developers (already expressing interest in sites within the village boundary). The Terms of Reference of the NPWG were agreed at the Parish Council Meeting of 10 September 2012 and are included within the Minutes attached.

The NPWG believes that the area identified – bounded by red ink on the attached map – is the appropriate area for inclusion within the Neighbourhood Plan. Points to note are:-

- It is the recognized boundary of Moulton village.
- The area covered is the same as that covered in the Village Design statement dated 2008.
- The area covered is currently surrounded by open spaces, giving clear green gaps with neighbouring villages.

Initial thinking is that the Neighbourhood Plan should focus on the following key topics when seeking input into the Plan from the broader community.

- Possible locations for new dwellings.
- Protecting the existing village structure and identity.
- Traffic flow within the village, including public transport.
- Protecting the existing landscape and wildlife.
- Sustainability issues such as school places and local amenities, including shops.

Moulton is a unique village in that there is only one road in and out – effectively making it a large cul-de-sac. This feature, whilst giving the village an unusual aspect, also creates delicate issues with traffic volumes and management.

Property turnover within the village is less than average when compared to other local communities of similar size. This suggests a settled population that appreciates the quality of life it enjoys.

The present property mix within the village is broad, ranging from terraced properties to large detached multi-bedroom units. Ownership is primarily private, although a small number of properties are under the control of Weaver Vale Housing Trust.

Property development has been steady and gradual since 1945 and no new developments have been sizeable. This has helped the village to retain a semi-rural feel with no types, or styles, of property dominating.

Commercial activity within the village is negligible and is confined to 4 Public House/Clubs, a Post Office, a Takeaway and a Convenience Store. With larger shopping locations, Northwich and Winsford, only three miles away there is no demand for further retail outlets. There are no industrial units, or major employers, within the village boundaries.

The village is largely surrounded by open countryside which helps to prevent "merging" with neighbouring villages, all of whom have different characteristics. The centre of the village is dominated by the Playing Fields, which now have QE II status.

To the west of the village is the River Weaver and area renowned for wildlife and an extensive footpath network that links the larger conurbations of Northwich and Winsford.

The village is well served by local service buses, connecting to Northwich, Winsford, Middlewich, Sandbach and Crewe. The nearest Railway Station is at Northwich, which is on the busy Chester to Manchester line.

Whilst the road infrastructure within the centre of the village is often under pressure, particularly when buses pass through, the surrounding roads are considered adequate and fast links to all nearby towns are a feature. The M6 Motorway is 6 miles to the east of the village.

- iv). The Group has no authority to make decisions on behalf of the Parish Council.
- v). To report progress, and make recommendations, to the monthly Parish Council Meetings.

The following were highlighted for report, action or to note:

- Cllrs. Vernon and Kershaw highlighted two overgrown hedges that are impeding pedestrians and motorists on Main Road. The Parish Clerk confirmed that Reports have already been submitted to CWAC and acknowledged.
- Cllr.
